Specific Trash Plan Overview and Due Diligence for the Subject Property (421 T Street, NW):

The trash management plans for the Subject Property were developed based on an hour-long site visit with the Director of Special Projects for Tenleytown Trash who is responsible for risk management and site feasibility for trash collection in Washington, D.C. The purpose of the site visit was to address any potential risks or hurdles regarding trash collection for the site. Prior to the site visit the Director for Special Projects was provided a full site plan, block plan, and design plans for the proposed scope and use of 421 T Street, NW.

Their conclusion, based on the needs of existing conditions and proposed use, is to utilize light trucks from their fleet that would reverse into the alley from 4th Street (the exact opposite of the trash truck shown in the previous presentation that showed front facing entry into the alley) and that the route would be adjusted as needed to minimize any impact at all on the alley or ease of use from adjacent property owners.
