REFERRAL MEMORANDUM AND NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Dear ANC Chair:

An Applicant within the boundaries of your ANC area is seeking zoning relief for a project or use that is not provided as a matter of right for the zoning district. This application was filed on <u>May 13, 2020</u> through the Interactive Zoning Information System (IZIS).

A public hearing has been scheduled by the Board of Zoning Adjustment (Board) on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 4, 2020 at 9:30 am</u>, virtually via WebEx, concerning the following application:

Application of Florida 21 LLC, pursuant to 11 DCMR Subtitle X, Chapter 9, for a special exception under Subtitle F § 5201, from the court requirements of Subtitle F § 202.1, to construct a partial fourth-story addition to an existing attached principal dwelling unit and convert it into a 4-unit apartment house in the RA-8 Zone at premises 2152 Florida Avenue, N.W. (Square 66, Lot 828).

HOW TO FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF WITH THE CASE

- The search results should produce the case on the right. Click "View Details".
- Click "View Full Log".
- This list comprises the full record in the case. Simply click "View" on any document you wish to see, and it will open a PDF document in a separate window.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CASE

As described in the Zoning Regulations of the District of Columbia (Regulations), the affected ANC is an automatic party to the case and the Board gives "great weight" to its written report.

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Though ANC reports may be filed at any time prior to the Board's final deliberation on the case, the ANC is strongly encouraged to submit their report no later than <u>seven days</u> prior to the public hearing date so that the Board has ample time to consider the ANC's position.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE VIRTUAL HEARING AND/OR SUBMIT COMMENTS:

A. Watch/listen to the hearing:

- Members of the public can watch and listen to the public hearing via Webex or YouTube Live, or they can listen to the audio of the hearing by calling via telephone.

B. Sign up to provide testimony at the virtual hearing:

- To provide oral comments during a virtual hearing, **<u>participants are strongly encouraged</u> <u>to sign up at least 24 hours before the hearing in order to be heard.</u>**

- **C.** Submit a statement into the record: After reviewing the record, submit written testimony, either a letter in support, or a letter in opposition. Submissions are <u>required to be sent at least 24 hours</u> <u>before the hearing</u>.
