## APPLICATION

Terry Carr (the "Applicant"), pursuant to Title 11 (2016 Zoning Regulations) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), Subtitle X, Chapter 9, requests special exceptions from the rear addition requirements of Subtitle E § 205.4, the lot occupancy requirements of Subtitle E § 304.1, and the rear yard requirements of Subtitle E § 306.1, to construct a rear, two-story addition to an existing, attached, two-story with basement, principal dwelling unit. The site is located in the RF-1 Zone at 428 11<sup>th</sup> Street SE (Square 992, Lot 805) and is served by a 11-foot rear public alley.

## RECOMMENDATION

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) has reviewed the application materials and has determined that the proposed action will not have adverse impacts on the District's transportation network. DDOT has no objection to the approval of this application.

## STREETSCAPE AND PUBLIC REALM

DDOT's lack of objection to this application should not be viewed as an approval of the public realm design. If any portion of this or future projects at the property propose elements within District owned right-of-way, the Applicant is required to pursue a public space permit through DDOT's permitting process. The Applicant should refer to Titles 11, 12A, and 24 of the DCMR, the most recent version of DDOT's <u>Design and Engineering Manual</u> (DEM), and the <u>Public Realm Design Manual</u> for public space regulations and design guidance. A permit application can be filed through the DDOT <u>Transportation</u> <u>Online Permitting System</u> (TOPS) website.
