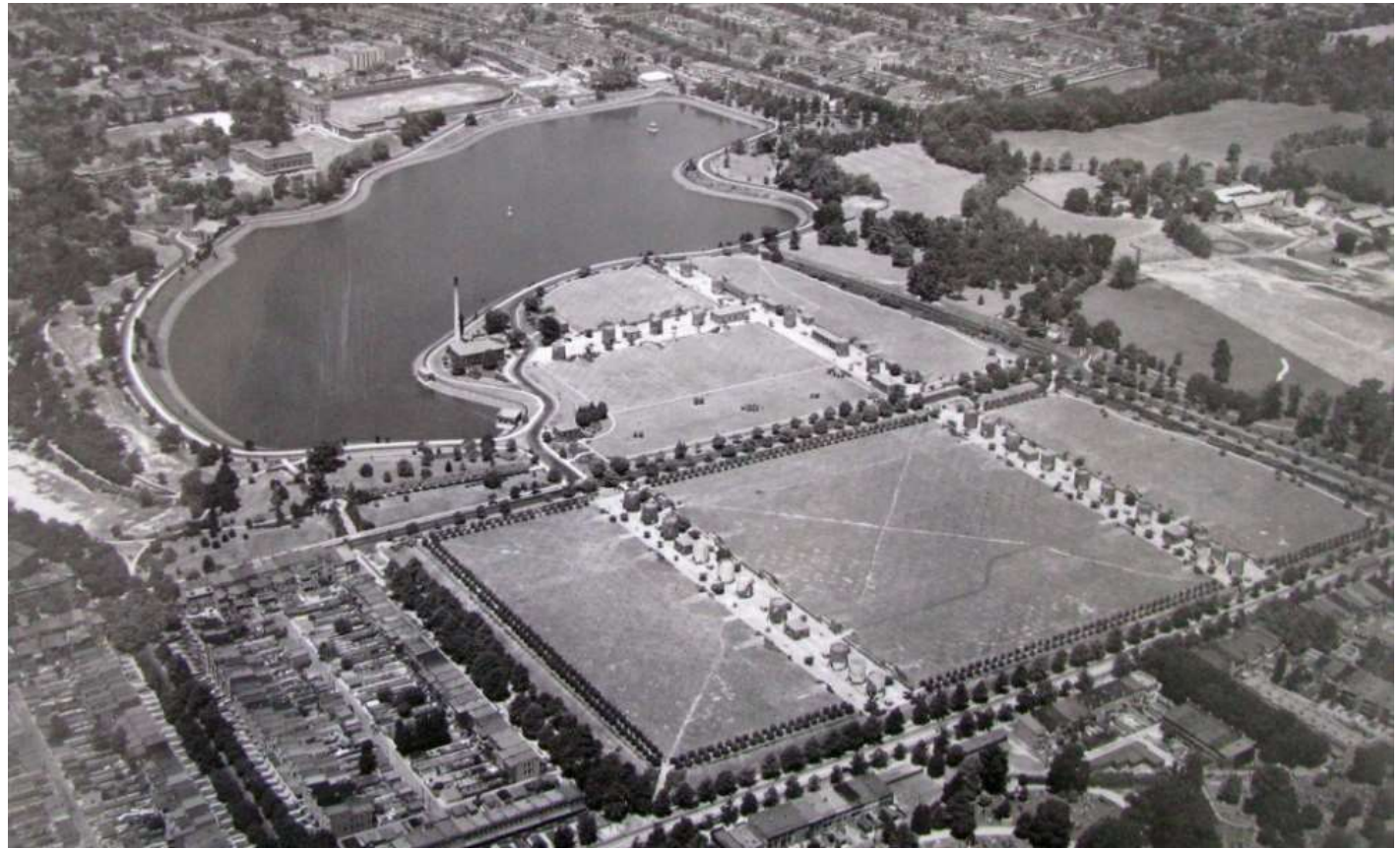

Preservation Benefits of Proposal

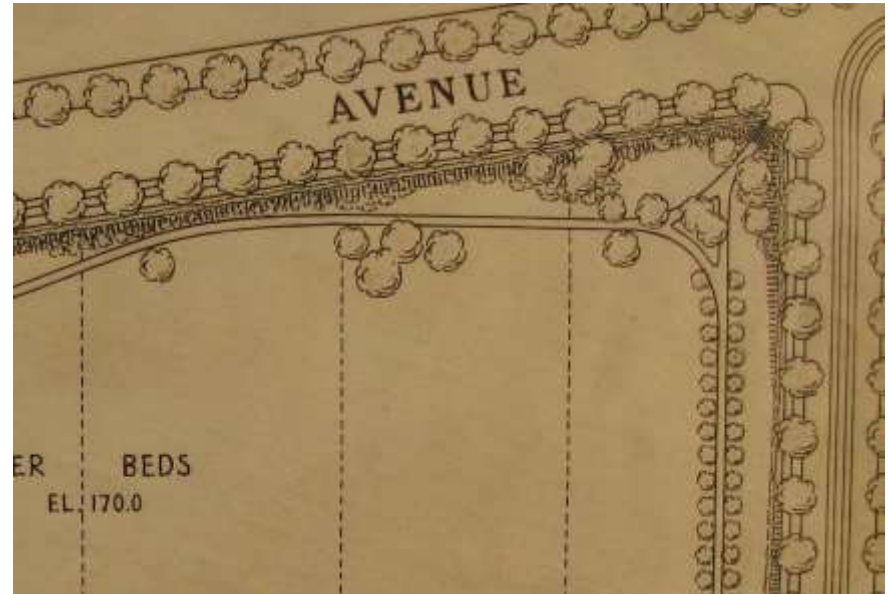
Retains:

- Form
- Organization
- Berm
- Plinth
- Above Ground Structures



Preservation Benefits of Proposal

Recreates the Olmsted Walk

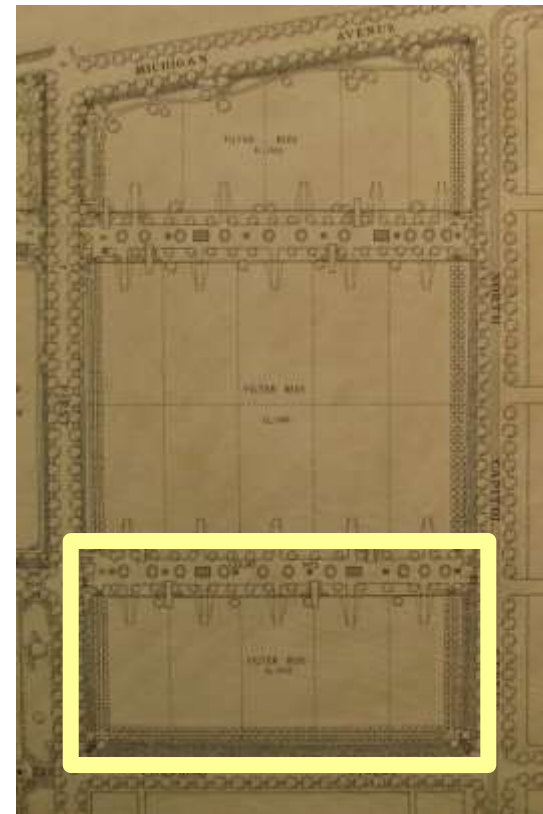


Preservation Benefits of Proposal

Allows the southern portion of the site to be read close to as originally intended

This southernmost portion is dedicated to park and retains:

- **Plain**
- **Raised elevations**
- **Relationship to South Service Court**
- **Relationship to surrounding streets**
- **South Service Court walls and portals**
- **Olmsted Walk**
- **Preservation of a portion of Cell 28**
- **Sense of place**
