TESTIMONY OF THE OFFICE OF THE DEPUTY MAYOR FOR PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

IN SUPPORT OF THE APPLICATION FOR DC STADIUM, LLC - CONSOLIDATED REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF A PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (Squares 603S, 605, 607, 661, & 665) CASE NO. 16-02

INTRODUCTION

Good evening, I am Brian Kenner, the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development. I am here to testify on the Case No. 16-02 for DC Stadium, LLC – Consolidated Review and Approval of a Planned Unit Development.

STATEMENT OF SUPPORT

On behalf of Mayor Bowser's Administration, I am privileged to voice our strong and enthusiastic support for the DC Stadium, LLC – Consolidated Planned Unit Development located in Squares 603S, 605, 607, 661, & 665. The District is the public sector partner for the Stadium project and also purchased the property in fall of 2015 explicitly for the DC United Soccer Stadium and to help catalyze the Buzzard Point neighborhood redevelopment efforts. The importance of this project is that it will not only bring a state-of-the-art 19,000 seat stadium to the District, but more importantly will help turn a previously underutilized industrial area into a productive publicly accessible mixed use community and promote economic development and vitality in the District of Columbia.

The District set very robust goals for economic development and community amenities, and we are pleased to see the various elements integrated into the stadium project. As the owner of the property, the District's specific role is to assist with the entitlement process to ensure that the project maximizes benefits to the community and the city. These goals and benefits include:

- Catalyze redevelopment in Buzzard Point
- Foster job creation, specifically nearly 300 construction jobs and 600 permanent jobs, with over 50% of all workers being DC residents.
- Build new public infrastructure and utilities for the Buzzard point community to create more walkable and bikeable neighborhoods
- Construct a new 19,000-seat soccer stadium which will attract one million annual new visitors per year
- Create public plaza and green spaces
- Provide Neighborhood-serving retail
- Assist with greater connectivity and access to connect people to the waterfront

- Offer a strong, comprehensive set of community benefits such as sports programing at local schools that supports the communities around the Buzzard Point neighborhood
- Support positive fiscal and economic impacts which includes anticipated total new tax revenues of over \$6 million annually for a total of almost \$200 million in new tax revenues over 30 years. All told, this project is expected to spur over \$1.6 billion in total economic activity in and around the stadium.

In addition to setting economic and community oriented benchmarks, the District has also commissioned numerous studies and reports addressing the planning, transportation and environmental needs for the Buzzard Point neighborhood. Further, these planning documents guide the redevelopment efforts and also determine the various modes of transportation in the entire Buzzard Point neighborhood.

Additionally, the District has also prepared a site specific Voluntary Cleanup Action Plan in accordance with the Department of Energy and Environment's regulations that determines the necessary environmental remediation actions for the soccer stadium site. Additionally, the Department of Energy and Environment has also heightened their enforcement actions to address the fugitive dust in the neighborhood.

And this summer, the District completed construction of the new wet and dry utilities surrounding the stadium property. Subsequently, the District plans to construct the new infrastructure including urban local roadways, streetscape improvements, LID drainage features, vehicular, bicycle and pedestrian routes along with the stadium construction.

The Consolidated Review and Approval of a Planned Unit Development is the muchneeded first step so as to allow the stadium to be constructed. Hence the Deputy Mayor's Office respectfully requests that the Commission approve this application for Consolidated Review and Approval of a Planned Unit Development so we may move forward with this state-of-the-art DC United Soccer Stadium project that will have a positive, lasting impact on the District and its residents

Comprehensive Overlook of Fugitive Dust Management and Control by the District Agencies:

Department of Energy and the Environment (DOEE) Actions Summary:

- DOEE inspected Buzzard Point neighborhood including facilities like Superior Concrete, Virginia Concrete, and Recycled Aggregate.
- DOEE took the necessary enforcement actions to manage fugitive dust from these facilities including Superior Concrete, Virginia Concrete, and Recycled Aggregate.
- Inspection and enforcement by DOEE on regular basis.

Department of Transportation (DDOT) Actions Summary:

- DDOT inspected the public right of way in Buzzard Point neighborhood.
- DDOT Street and Bridge Maintenance performed pothole repair on the streets surrounding the stadium site, particularly Potomac Avenue SW, to limit dust caused by poor road conditions.

Department of Public Works (DPW) Actions Summary:

. DPW performed regular thorough street sweeping and flushing (watering down) of the residential streets around the Stadium site, including First Street, Half Street, and Q Street since summer 2016.

Department of General Services (DGS) Actions Summary:

- DGS created a comprehensive Traffic Control Plan for the Buzzard Point neighborhood.
- Created a "Work Zone" for the Buzzard Point neighborhood.
- Created dedicated routes for the construction trucks so as to ensure that they do not enter the residential neighborhood with dust.
- Created dedicated routes for the delivery trucks from facilities like Superior Concrete, Virginia Concrete, and Recycled Aggregate so as to ensure that they do not enter the residential neighborhood with dust.
- DGS installed multiple air monitoring devices on the Stadium site in addition to the handheld devices to monitor dust.
- DGS created "Air Quality Monitoring Plan" with regular reporting.
- DGS created "Erosion & Sediment Control Plan" for the Stadium site to manage dust leaving the construction site.
- DGS followed the "Best Practices" to manage dust for the Stadium site and infrastructure construction.

Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) Actions Summary:

- · MPD enforced the "Work Zone" for the Buzzard Point.
- Reduced speed limit for all vehicles/trucks to manage any dust that might be kicked up or carried by that traffic.
- Doubled fines for moving violations in order to limit the impact on residents due to construction traffic.

PROPOSED NAVY YARD CIRCULATOR EXTENSION

The 2014 Circulator Transit Development Plan (TDP) recommended extending the Union Station to Navy Yard route to the Waterfront Metro Station. DDOT's top priority in the past 2 years has been providing high quality, reliable service and addressing vehicle maintenance needs. The primary limitation on Circulator fleet expansion is the lack of adequate maintenance facilities, DDOT is currently working with the Department of General Services to identify property to meet short-term and long-term maintenance facility needs.

As DDOT has worked to resolve these service and maintenance issues, we are advancing the planning for the route extension and taking into account the opening of Phase I of the Wharf in October 2017. The Community Benefits Agreement for the DC United Soccer Stadium allocated funding for purchasing buses specifically to reinstate the north/south route to the Convention Center. This route is already served by the #74 Metrobus, which runs to P Street SW on 12-15 minute headways in peak hours, but does not meet WMATA's performance criteria for ridership and cost recovery. In addition to route expansions to serve Southwest neighborhoods with Circulator service, DDOT will be using the mechanism of the DC United Traffic Operations and Parking Plan (TOPP) to evaluate how Circulator service can be augmented to support stadium operations and provide service to Buzzard Point in conjunction with stadium events.

Furthermore, in 2017 DDOT will begin a system-wide Circulator Service Development study which will take a comprehensive and quantitative look at existing and potential Circulator routes and result in a 2017 Transit Development Plan. Through this planning process, DDOT will evaluate options to enable the implementation of a detour of the Southwest Waterfront extension of the Union Station - Navy Yard route on game days to provide service south of M Street for stadium events.
















NAVY YARD PROPOSED CIRCULATOR EXTENSION - MAP

















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
