Dear Chairperson Hood and Members of the Commission:

The Georgetown Community Partnership (GCP), established under the Georgetown University Campus Plan, promotes consensus-based decisions among University, community, student, and MedStar representatives, to further the implementation of the Campus Plan by maintaining a collegial forum for discussion, information-sharing and decision-making.

We are pleased to report that the members of the steering committee of GCP have worked collegially on key details of this application for further processing and that the GCP steering committee members, in their individual capacity as steering committee members, have reached consensus that the application is worthy of the Commission's approval.

We note in particular that –

- A modern Surgical Pavilion will provide substantial benefits for the community and the region;
- The design of the project will transform the northern entrance of the campus by creating a green and welcoming space along Reservoir Road;
- MedStar has worked with the community to mitigate noise from helicopters and ambulances, and to mitigate the impact of traffic; and


- MedStar's construction management plan is appropriately sensitive to the need to minimize noise and disruption during the multi-year construction period.
