The Lady Bird development team has been tremendously responsive to community concerns as evidenced by their sensitive incorporation of multiple design features that will enhance the development's presence in the neighborhood. It would replace an abandoned grocery store with related, rapidly deteriorating structured parking and significantly upgrade an unsightly service alley that is an eyesore in our community.
