As the Ward 7 Councilmember, I join ANC7B in writing to express my support of the proposed Zoning Map Amendment for the Shops at Penn Hill (formerly Penn Branch Shopping Center) located at 3200 Pennsylvania Ave., SE, submitted by Jair Lynch Real Estate Partners of behalf of 3200 Penn Ave PJV, LLC.

The Shops at Penn Hill site has long been a key neighborhood retail center for Ward 7 but has significant untapped potential. Various plans for the re-development of the site over the years have stalled for a variety of reasons, yet this site remains a key opportunity to provide much needed quality retail, job opportunities, and living options for our residents.

The re-development of this site has been contemplated for over a decade in both the 2006 DC Comprehensive Plan and the 2008 Pennsylvania Ave SE Corridor Small Area Plan. The proposed Map Amendment will help in removing barriers to the realization of that vision. The development team from Jair Lynch Real Estate Partners has made numerous presentations and has received overwhelming support for the project from the community. The development team has created an opportunity for revitalization within this corridor of Pennsylvania Avenue and respects the rich diversity of the residents who currently reside in the neighboring area.
