## Neighborhood + Art = Community

The Bard is an innovative mixed-use studio, office, and residential development that will consolidate the Shakespeare Theatre Company's (STC) production facilities, rehearsal spaces, company housing, and administrative operations.

### The New Building will Include:

- \* 34 housing units for artists and fellows
- \* Facilities for costume and craft fabrication
- \* Rehearsal spaces including a multipurpose space
- \* Education classrooms, operations facilities and administrative offices

In addition, The Bard will include approximately 143 market and affordable rate residential units along with dedicated onsite parking spaces.

### Education for the Community:

Consistent with STC's central mission—to be the leading force in producing and preserving the highest quality classic theatre—STC's Education Department is positioned as both a local and national resource for learners of all ages. Among STC's programming is the annual summer camp for ages 7-18. Under the guidance of theatre professionals, participants develop fundamental acting skills using classical theatre techniques.

Shakespeare Theatre Company: an extraordinary commitment to artistic vision, and creative theater development. We will build a new building design with high quality materials, building elements, covering both environmental and operational sustainability for the Company for generations to come.

### The Bard will Have:

- \* Accessible and STC's complete spaces for attendees and cast members (D-1) building, including stage, costume and prop storage space
- \* Flexible spaces for rehearsal, administrative, business and retail
- \* A public plaza between the Silver building and the Shakespeare Theatre Company to the existing national stadium along the street
- \* An energy efficient design with a LEED Silver rating including high performance envelope walls and glazing, extensive and intensive green roof areas and efficient storm water management systems
- \* A modern facility designed to better support STC operations, improve community outreach, and maintain STC's strong sense of the Nation's premier Classical Theatre company.
