CASE NO. 20-33 (The University of the District of Columbia – Campus Plan Approval for the Period of 2020 – 2030 ("2020 Campus Plan")

THIS CASE IS OF INTEREST TO ANC 3F

On December 21, 2020, the University of the District of Columbia ("UDC") filed an application (the "Application") requesting the Zoning Commission for the District of Columbia (the "Commission") to approve a new Campus Plan for 2020-2030 (the "2020 Campus Plan") to replace the current 2011-2020 Campus Plan approved by Z.C. Order No. 11-02/11-02A, as modified by Z.C. Order No. 11-02B (the "2011 Campus Plan"), pursuant to Subtitle X, Chapter 1, and Subtitle Z § 302 of the Zoning Regulations (Title 11 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, Zoning Regulations of 2016, to which all references are made unless otherwise specified) for the Van Ness campus (the "Van Ness Campus") located at Square 1964, part of Lot 812, with an address of 4200 Connecticut Avenue, N.W.

THE VAN NESS CAMPUS

The Van Ness Campus is bounded:

- To the east by Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Veazey Terrace, N.W., commercial property, Windom Place, N.W., and a public alley;
- To the south by Van Ness Street, N.W.;
- To the west by International Court, N.W.; and
- To the north by Yuma Street, N.W.

The Van Ness Campus includes academic and administrative uses, athletic fields, and campus life facilities related to the University and is located in the R-1-B zone.

THE APPLICATION

The Application proposes to maintain the parameters of the 2011 Campus Plan with the following changes:

- Increase the student population from 6,500 to 7,000 on a headcount basis;
- Maintain the approximately 732 existing on-campus parking spaces;
- Modernize and upgrade the ten existing academic buildings and related facilities through interior renovations, infrastructure upgrades, and minor structural improvements;
- Promote the University's distinct identity and wayfinding for public use of campus;
- Increase green landscaping and sustainable features; and

• Implement urban design improvements at Van Ness Street, N.W., Veasy Terrace, N.W., and Windom Place, N.W.

<u> 2020 Campus Plan – New Development</u>

The 2020 Campus Plan seeks authorization for the following potential future development and improvements:

- Vertical and new floor additions to Buildings 32, 42, and 43 that would:
 - Add approximately 170,000 square feet ("sf") of gross floor area, including approximately 120,000 sf for a housing site and 40,000 sf for potential vertical additions to existing buildings;
 - Increase the total 1.54 floor area ratio approved for the Van Ness Campus by the 2011 Campus Plan to 1.56 FAR;
 - Increase the total lot occupancy to 34%; and
 - Have building heights ranging from 2 to 7 stories, with one site proposed with a maximum of 8 stories;
- Reprograming existing buildings 41, 43, and 44 for academic/administrative purposes or student housing;
- Green roofs on Buildings 32/42, 38/39, and 47, as well as on the proposed new buildings;
- A new artificial turf practice field in the southwestern portion of the Van Ness Campus; and
- New outdoor spaces at the "B" level of the area adjacent Building 32 and directly to the north and east of Building 42 towards Building 47.

The public hearing will be conducted in accordance with the contested case provisions of Subtitle Z, Chapter 4, as well as the text adopted by the Commission on October 15, 2020, in Z.C. Case No. 20-11, as published in the Notice of Final Rulemaking published in the *D.C. Register* on October 30, 2020.

<u>How to participate as a witness – oral presentation</u>

Interested persons or representatives of organizations may be heard at the virtual public hearing. All individuals, organizations, or associations wishing to testify in this case are **strongly encouraged to sign up to testify at least 24 hours prior to the start of the hearing** on OZ's website at https://dcoz.dc.gov/ or by calling Sharon Schellin at (202) 727-0340 in order to ensure the success of the new virtual public hearing procedures.

The Commission also requests that all witnesses prepare their testimony in writing, submit the written testimony prior to giving statements, and limit oral presentations to summaries of the most important points. The Commission must base its decision on the record before them. The following maximum time limits for oral testimony shall be adhered to and no time may be ceded:

1. Applicant and parties in support	60 minutes collectively
2. Parties in opposition	60 minutes collectively

3. Organizations	5 minutes each
4. Individuals	3 minutes each

Pursuant to Subtitle Z § 408.4, the Commission may increase or decrease the time allowed above, in which case, the presiding officer shall ensure reasonable balance in the allocation of time between proponents and opponents.

How to participate as a witness - written statements

Written statements, in lieu of personal appearances or oral presentation, may be submitted for inclusion in the record, provided that **all written comments and/or testimony must be submitted to the record at least 24 hours prior to the start of the hearing, unless approved by the Commission upon request to be introduced at the public hearing.** The public is encouraged to submit written testimony through the Interactive Zoning Information System (IZIS) at https://app.dcoz.dc.gov/Login.aspx; however, written statements may also be submitted by e-mail to zcsubmissions@dc.gov. Please include the case number on your submission. If you are unable to use either of these means of submission, please contact Sharon Schellin at (202) 727-0340 for further assistance.

How to participate as a party

Any person who desires to participate as a party in this case must so request and must comply with the provisions of Subtitle Z § 404.1. A party has the right to cross-examine witnesses, to submit proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, to receive a copy of the written decision of the Commission, and to exercise the other rights of parties as specified in the Zoning Regulations. If you are still unsure of what it means to participate as a party and would like more information on this, please contact OZ at dcoz@dc.gov or at (202) 727-6311.

Except for an affected ANC, any person who desires to participate as a party in this case must clearly demonstrate that the person's interests would likely be more significantly, distinctly, or uniquely affected by the proposed zoning action than other persons in the general public. Persons seeking party status shall file with the Commission, not less than 14 days prior to the date set for the hearing, or 14 days prior to a scheduled public meeting if seeking advanced party status consideration, a Form 140 - Party Status Application, a copy of which may be downloaded from OZ's website at: https://app.dcoz.dc.gov/Help/Forms.html.

"Great weight" to written report of ANC

Subtitle Z § 406.2 provides that the written report of an affected ANC shall be given great weight if received at any time prior to the date of a Commission meeting to consider final action, including any continuation thereof on the application, and sets forth the information that the report must contain. Pursuant to Subtitle Z § 406.3, an ANC that wishes to participate in the hearing must file a written report at least seven days in advance of the public hearing and provide the name of the person who is authorized by the ANC to represent it at the hearing.
