CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. Today's date is March 13th, 2023. We are convening and broadcasting this public hearing by video conferencing. My name is Anthony Hood, and I'm joined by Vice Chair Miller, Commissioner May and Commissioner Imamura. We're also joined by the Office of Zoning staff, Ms. Sharon Schellin, and Mr. Paul Young, who will be handling all of our virtual operations. Also, the Office of Zoning Legal Division, our head policy person, well, not policy person, but our head Office of Zoning Legal Division counsel, Mrs. Hillary Lovick. I will ask all others to introduce themselves at the appropriate time.

The virtual public hearing notice is available on the Office of Zoning's website. This proceeding is being recorded by a court reporter, and the platforms used are Webex and YouTube live. The video will be available on the Office of Zoning's website after the hearing.

All persons planning to testify should have signed up in advance and will be called by name at the appropriate time. At the time of sign-up, all participants will complete the oath or affirmation required by Subtitle Z, 408.7. Accordingly, all those listening on Webex or by phone will be muted during the hearing and only those who have signed up to participate or testify will be unmuted at the appropriate time. When called,

please state your name before providing your testimony. When you have finished speaking, please mute your audio. If you experience difficulty accessing Webex or with your telephone call-in, or if you have not signed up, then please call our OZ hotline number at 202-727-0789.

The subject of this evening's case is Zoning Commission Case No. 22-33, the NHP Foundation map amendment at Square 3351, Lot 12, 7050 Eastern Avenue, Northwest. Again, today's date is March 13, 2023.

The hearing will be conducted in accordance with provisions of 11Z, DCMR Chapter 4 as follows: Preliminary matters; the Applicant's case, the Applicant has up to 60 minutes; the report of other government agencies, the report of the Department of Transportation and the Office of Planning. And then we have the report of the ANC. Testimony of organizations—then we testimony of organizations; organizations will have five minutes and individuals will have three minutes. And we will hear in the following order from those who are in support, opposition or undeclared. Then we will have rebuttal and closing by the Applicant.

Again, the OZ hotline number is 202-727-0789 for any concerns during these proceedings. And in this particular case, the ANC is -- (indiscernible) tell me right quick, that will help me and I won't have to look for it. What's the ANC? It's two ANCs, I believe.

VICE CHAIR MILLER: 4B.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: 4B and -- okay, is it -- okay, ANC

4B. I got mixed up with BZA. Okay. So at this time -- then

we'll have rebuttal and closing by the Applicant.

At this time, the Commission will consider any preliminary matters. Does the staff have any preliminary matters. Thank you, Vice Chair.

Ms. Schellin, any preliminary matters?

MS. SCHELLIN: Yes, there's two quick ones. OP is requesting a waiver to accept its hearing report into the record because it was filed less than ten days before the hearing. So that's the first one.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Any objections to the OP report?

Okay. I am sure there were some last developments. So thank you. We will accept that.

MS. SCHELLIN: So that's by consensus?

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Yes.

MS. SCHELLIN: Okay. And the second is the Applicant's motion. They are requesting a waiver from Subtitle Z, Section 402.3, and that's with regard to posting the property 40 days prior to the public hearing. They filed -- in filing their affidavit 30 days prior to the hearing. This is at exhibit 24. They posted the property on February 21st, which is 21 days prior to the hearing. Of course, they state in their letter the different ways of notice. We sent out public hearing notice 40

days prior. It was posted on our website. It was posted in the D.C. Register. So this is just one other way of posting and it was just short of the 40 days. So if the Commission would consider that waiver.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Let me hear from my colleagues. And while you're doing that, give me -- let me take a five-minute break. Just give me five minutes. Let me do something. I got something that came up. Give me five minutes.

I am very sorry, I said five minutes. Has everybody left their computer? I am extremely sorry. I thought that was (audio interference). Everybody always waits until 4 o'clock to call me. They know I have hearings. And I thought that was an emergency, so forgive me. I'm sorry. Okay.

Ms. Schellin, could you repeat that? I'm sorry.

MS. SCHELLIN: Yes, It's the requested exhibit, I believe it was 24 by the Applicant regarding the shortage of posting the property.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Okay. And I think the Applicant mentioned the other ways of notice. And I can tell by the record that the word has definitely gotten out. So let's see if -- let me see how my colleagues feel on this, by the way. Do we have any objections? Not seeing any. Okay. We will accept that as well, Ms. Schellin.

MS. SCHELLIN: I'm sorry. And so the Applicant is represented by Mary Carolyn Brown of the Brown Law Firm. ANC 4B

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1	is represented by Evan Yeats. And there are some proffered expert
2	witnesses. John Welsh, although he's with the Applicant, we
3	don't usually you guys don't usually give the Applicant expert
4	witness.
5	COMMISSIONER MAY: Ms. Schellin, I did not see actual
6	credentials for expert witnesses in the record. Did I miss that?
7	MS. SCHELLIN: I think this was actually just supposed
8	to be the witnesses. So I don't think I think that was a
9	mistake. They're listed under experts, but I think that was just
10	who they're with, who their witnesses are, the Applicant's
11	representatives.
12	So other than that, Ms. Brown would like to make a
13	statement to the commissioners before starting. If you guys
14	would indulge her for a moment. If Mr. Young could bring her

16 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: So Ms. Schellin, let me make sure I
17 understand, we don't have any expert witness.

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MS. SCHELLIN: No, no. That was -- I think staff meant that as other -- as the Applicant's representatives instead of experts.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Okay. Thank you. All right.

Well, good afternoon, Ms. Brown. We'll turn it over to you.

MS. BROWN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, and members of the Commission. For the record, Carolyn Brown with the Brown

Law Firm here on behalf of the NHP Foundation and Elm Gardens owner, the Applicant in this case.

Just one quick correction. Initially, the application was filed as Lot 12. We subsequently corrected that to be Lot 813, and that's in the record. I don't have the exhibit number off the top of my head, but just to make sure that that's clear.

And then secondly, just to confirm, no expert witnesses.

I'd like to begin by asking for a continuance of tonight's hearing until the next available hearing date, which I understand from staff is April 6th. The additional time will allow us the opportunity --

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Ms. Brown, we lost you.

MS. BROWN: -- a chance to hear from them directly about their concerns. While we believe there is adequate and ample notice of the hearing, the NHP Foundation wants to be a "good neighbor" and abide by the spirit of the Commission's new Racial Equity Tool issued just last month -- issued just last month, that does request the Applicant to have ample community outreach. While notice was mailed to the cooperative, it's mailing address is on 14th Street, which is different from the physical location of the residences. I believe that's where the confusion may be and on what kind of notice they received. So we now have the email addresses and telephone numbers of those residents of the cooperative who signed up to testify, and someone

from the NHP Foundation will be reaching out to them shortly. So we therefore ask you to continue this hearing to the next available date. Thank you. And I'll be happy to answer any questions you have.

Thank you, CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Ms. Brown. wondering how I was going to -- we were going to kind of facilitate and go through this tonight with the -- some of the letters that we received, Exhibits 32, 33, and 34. But I want to commend you for coming up front and making that statement and also coming into compliance with our new Racial Equity Tool and also which is key for engagement. So I really appreciate this Applicant willing to do that. I'm looking forward to -- even if we don't agree on everything -- but some better outcomes from what I've read here so far, especially with the opposition. I want to commend you for recommending that to us. I know I'm acceptable to it, but let me open it up to my colleagues. heard the request from Ms. Brown, which I think is very thoughtful and most in line with the way this Commission moves.

So Commissioner May, any questions or comments?

COMMISSIONER MAY: No, I support continuing the case.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Commissioner Imamura?

COMMISSIONER IMAMURA: I am in support of continuing

23 the case.

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CHAIRPERSON HOOD: And Vice Chair Miller?

25 VICE CHAIR MILLER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Yes,

thank you, Ms. Brown, for that statement. And we'll look forward to hearing about your community engagement with the neighbor in opposition and any mitigating conditions or ways that might be able to address their concerns. So thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: So at this time, Ms. Schellin, I'll turn it back over to you to come up with some dates or date.

MS. SCHELLIN: So because it's publicly announced, no further notice is needed. We'll put this on for April 6th at 4 o'clock p.m., and we will update our website and, of course, IZIS so that our calendar notes that as April 6th at 4 o'clock p.m.

If Applicant could update with regard to community outreach and any update you have with regard to the Racial Equity Tool since that is now in effect. That would be great if you could do that at least a week before, maybe ten days before, that would be really good.

I would ask Ms. Lovick if she has anything to add with regard to that. Is that -- does that cover everything, Ms. Lovick, as far as the Racial Equity Tool, updating the community and anything else that that may need to be done?

MS. LOVICK: I mean, the only thing I would add is if you would just respond to part two of the tool, as applicable. Thank you.

MS. SCHELLIN: That's it.

VICE CHAIR MILLER: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Vice Chair Miller had something.

VICE CHAIR MILLER: Yeah, I'm sorry. I just realized. I won't be able to make the April 6th hearing date, so -- which is fine. I can -- if the decision is later, I can participate or the three of you there. It's the second night of Passover. We usually do our Passover dinner on the first night, but we just happened to change it to the second night, which is when that is. So I'll be getting ready for 25 people to come over to my house, and I don't think I can handle this and that at the same time. But you can feel free to proceed and I'll be happy to read the record.

MS. SCHELLIN: And it is a two vote case, Commissioner Miller, so you could always participate -- if they take a bench decision, you can always participate at final.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Well, let me check everybody else's schedule on April 6th.

Commissioner May, do you think you have any conflicts?

COMMISSIONER MAY: Well it's the day of the monthly NCPC meeting and it's too early to know what the agenda will be. And usually I can escape if I need to, to get here by 4 o'clock, but I cannot absolutely say that's the case. I mean, I -- in the worst case, I might be a little bit late. But it's -- again, I can't say for sure.

CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Commissioner Imamura, any -- this is probably going to be longer.

1	Commissioner Imamura, any you think you have any
2	problems on that day?
3	COMMISSIONER IMAMURA: (Indiscernible), Mr. Chairman.
4	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: I am right now. So let me ask this,
5	Ms. Schellin, due to the uncertainty, could we well, we can't
6	do it Wednesday. Who has BZA? Well, never mind. I don't even
7	want to go there.
8	COMMISSIONER MAY: From what I see, next Monday or
9	Thursday would be April 24th, but maybe something's already
10	booked there, Ms. Schellin.
11	MS. SCHELLIN: So you said April 24th?
12	COMMISSIONER MAY: Yeah.
13	MS. SCHELLIN: We do have some ANC training in the
14	evening, so that's not a good day. We have April 20th open.
15	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Does anybody have anything else?
16	COMMISSIONER MAY: Okay.
17	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: And the only reason is, I would go
18	ahead with it on the 6th, so we can accommodate the Applicant,
19	especially since they're trying to do it, but NCPC.
20	MS. LOVICK: We have 20-08B on the 20th.
21	MS. SCHELLIN: They've rescheduled for May.
22	MS. LOVICK: Oh.
23	MS. SCHELLIN: So that date became available.
24	MS. LOVICK: Okay.
25	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: I lost my train of thought. What
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was I saying? So do we want to chance the 6th, Commissioner May? 1 2 I mean, we can wait an hour, 30 minutes. Any objections? COMMISSIONER MAY: I don't mind doing that, if you 3 4 don't mind, I just can't. CHAIRPERSON HOOD: No, no, I don't mind. 5 6 MS. SCHELLIN: It's up to the Applicant. If they want 7 to wait, it's up to them, you know. 8 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: If they want to wait until the 20th. 9 But if we want to wait an hour, so that's up to us. 10 MS. SCHELLIN: Yes. CHAIRPERSON HOOD: That's not up to the Applicant. 11 12 MS. SCHELLIN: Right. 13 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: All right. So do we want to chance 14 it or do we want to just move it to the 20th? 15 MS. BROWN: You're not asking for my opinion, but if 16 17 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Give me your opinion, because we 18 can't predict the future. So give me your opinion. 19 MS. BROWN: We would really prefer to move forward on the 6th. And if it starts at 5 o'clock, I think everybody would 20 21 be fine with that and we could accommodate Commissioner May's 2.2 schedule that way. 23 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: So Ms. Brown, if it starts at 24 9 o'clock, then what happens? 25 COMMISSIONER MAY: The NCPC meeting will not go until

1 9 o'clock. 2 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Okay. So we're going to go with Remember, Commissioner May and Ms. Brown both said that 3 that. we won't have that 9 o'clock problem. 4 5 COMMISSIONER MAY: Usually we are done four-ish, and 6 sometimes when we get to the end, it's an information presentation 7 that I can watch later. 8 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Okay. Okay. So we will stick with 9 that. And Vice Chair, you'll be able to participate because it's 10 a two vote case. And actually if you -- it depends upon what happens, you may have to read the record, if you don't mind. 11 12 MS. SCHELLIN: Four o'clock? 13 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Let's keep it. Let me ask this. 14 Vice Chair, if we move it earlier, will that help you with your 25 guests or it doesn't matter? 15 16 MS. SCHELLIN: But that won't help. 17 COMMISSIONER MAY: It makes it worse for me. 18 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: No, that's all right. VICE CHAIR MILLER: I'll be there for the second vote. 19 20 CHAIRPERSON HOOD: All right. Forget it, forget it. 21 Let me be quiet.

22 Go ahead, Ms. Schellin.

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COMMISSIONER MAY: Maybe we should do it at 9 o'clock.

24 Maybe Vice Chair Miller will be done with his --

VICE CHAIR MILLER: That is more realistic, yeah.

1	MS. SCHELLIN: Do we want to keep it at 4 o'clock or
2	start at 5 o'clock? I've heard both sides.
3	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Go ahead, Commissioner May.
4	COMMISSIONER MAY: What if we did it at 4:30? I don't
5	want to push it automatically to 5:00, but do it at 4:30?
6	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: 4:30 is good.
7	MS. SCHELLIN: Everybody's good with 4:30?
8	Okay, 4:30. I will schedule it for 4:30 instead of
9	5:00. That works.
10	CHAIRPERSON HOOD: Yeah, that works.
11	All right, so with this we will continue on April
12	6th at 4:30, and we will continue this case. And thanks again.
13	We will continue Case No. 22-33 on April 6th at 4:30.
14	With that, see you all on April 6th. Good night.
15	MS. SCHELLIN: Thanks.
16	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter was adjourned.)
