Chairman Franklin: May I make an announcement please, if you'll be quiet. Obviously there's more than passing interest in this matter tonight. We've made an effort to get a larger room to accommodate this hearing. We tried to get the Council chambers and were unable to do so. Obviously the fire, that was somebody else's decision. The fire code does not permit as many people in this room as are presently here.

And I asked the police to ask you to, who are standing who obviously arrived later than the others, to leave so we can continue and we'll have a continuation hearing on Monday, which will --

(People are shouting out things.)

Chairman Franklin: We have a schedule of a hearing tonight and we have a continuation hearing scheduled for Monday. I will ask the staff to make sure that a larger room is made available for that purpose.

(People are shouting out things all at once.)

Chairman Franklin: Hang on, hang on. Now, if, if the people who are standing are not going to leave, we're not going to be able to continue this hearing.

(Applause and shouting.)

(Lots of people talking at once.)

Chairman Franklin: Can we get Ms. Mason to approach the bench? Can I have your attention again, please. The Commission has decided, the Commission has decided that we ought not to penalize people because the room is too small, people who are obviously interested in the proceedings. So we will not have a hearing this evening.

(Applause and shouting.)

1 Chairman Franklin: Hold it, hold it. We will, we will make a good
2 faith effort to have our regularly scheduled continuation hearing that was set for
3 Monday, take place in the Council chambers through the good office of Hilda Mason,
4 if we can ask that. And we will also then have to schedule a continuation of the
5 Monday hearing in Council Chambers or at least some other room that is able to
6 accommodate all the people who are obviously interested in the matter this evening.

7 I did not want to, the Commission does not wish to, the
8 Commission does not wish to penalize people who arrived late and were unable to
9 get seats. So 7:00 Monday and -- well you arrived later than those who got seats,
10 let's put it that way. And we hope that we'll be able to get the Council Chamber. If
11 we cannot get the Council Chamber, a sign will be posted there as to where the
12 alternative location is. Conceivably, Martin Luther King Library.

13 So please try to arrive early on Monday in the Council Chamber
14 and if you are not there, the alternative location. Thank you very much.
