Today's date is February 7th, 2019. 6 We are 7 located at the Jerrily R. Kress Memorial Hearing 8 Room. 9 My name is Anthony Hood. Joining me 10 are Vice Chair Miller, Commissioner Shapiro, and Commissioner May. We are also joined by the 11 12 Office of Zoning Staff Ms. Sharon Schellin as 13 well as the Office of Attorney General Ms. 14 Lovick, Office of Planning Staff Ms. Steingasser and Mr. Kirschenbaum. 15 Did I get that right? Kirschenbaum. 16 Kir. 17 Okay, well, I'm in the neighborhood. 18 Kirschenbaum. 19 This proceeding Okay. is being 20 recorded by a court reporter. 4	consider any preliminary matters. Does the staff
5	have any preliminary matters?
6	MS. SCHELLIN: The Petitioner is
7	proffering one expert witness, Amy Thompson, in
8	land use planning. Other than that, no other
9	preliminary matters.
10	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Did we qualify Ms.
11	Thompson before?
12	MS. SCHELLIN: We did not find her on
13	our list.
14	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. Any objections?
15	COMMISSIONER MAY: It hardly seems
16	like it's needed, but I don't have any objections
17	having read her resume. So that's fine. I don't
18	even think we'll have a question, so.
19	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. I thought we
20	did Ms. Thompson previously. I can't remember
21	what I did last night but, okay, but I just
22	remember seeing the resume. Maybe it was BZA. I
23	know I've seen the resume.
24	Okay. All right, so no problems.
25	All right. I think I know this

1	gentleman. We know this gentleman here, but you
2	can introduce yourself, and you may begin.
3	MR. FERRIS: Lawrence Ferris with the
4	law firm of Goulston and Storrs, here on behalf
5	of the Applicant.
6	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay, Mr. Ferris, the
7	floor is yours.
8	MR. FERRIS: Yes. I don't know if you
9	would like to proceed with a full presentation or
10	if you have any questions.
11	CHAIRMAN HOOD: What did the gentlemen
12	behind you tell you to do?
13	MR. FERRIS: We're happy to rest on
14	the record unless the
15	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay.
16	MR. FERRIS: Commission has any
17	additional questions.
18	CHAIRMAN HOOD: That's fine. I think
19	this record is complete. So I didn't want Mr.
20	Ferris to have it too easy, but that's fine.
21	Okay. I think the record is actually
22	complete.
23	Commissioners, any questions or
24	comments? Okay.
25	VICE CHAIR MILLER: I do have one.

1	CHAIRMAN HOOD: You have a question?
2	VICE CHAIR MILLER: I do.
3	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. Vice Chair
4	Miller.
5	VICE CHAIR MILLER: Thank you, Mr.
6	Chairman.
7	I know that on a zoning map amendment
8	it's a matter of consistency with the comp plan,
9	which this clearly is consistent, but and we
10	don't get into what the intended use is. But I'd
11	like to know if there is an intended use at this
12	stage?
13	MR. FERRIS: No. Our client has not
14	gotten to that level of development yet with the
15	plans.
16	VICE CHAIR MILLER: And did you choose
17	the map amendment approach because of the
18	litigation records with PODs that this Commission
19	has approved? Is that why you went the map
20	amendment, the map amendment approach versus POD?
21	Or you would have gone that way anyway?
22	MR. FERRIS: You know, I can't speak
23	to the intent going back that far. It's
24	VICE CHAIR MILLER: When did you file?
25	MR. FERRIS: I'm sorry?

1	VICE CHAIR MILLER: When did you file
2	this application, approximately? After all the
3	POD litigation started I'm sure.
4	MR. FERRIS: I believe it was in May
5	of last year.
6	VICE CHAIR MILLER: Okay.
7	MR. FERRIS: Yes, sir.
8	VICE CHAIR MILLER: All right, thanks.
9	MR. FERRIS: I appreciate the question.
10	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. Any other
11	questions?
12	Is there anyone here representing
13	oh, that's right, this is a map amendment. Okay.
14	All right, let's go to the Office of
15	Planning.
16	MR. KIRSCHENBAUM: Good evening,
17	Chairman Hood and members of the Zoning
18	Commission. Jonathan Kirschenbaum for the Office
19	of Planning.
20	We recommend that the Zoning
21	Commission approve this application. And we
22	stand on the record. Thank you.
23	Please let me know if you have any
24	questions.
25	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Thank you, Mr.

Kirschenbaum. We appreciate -- did I get 1 right this time? I'm sure I'm doing better than 2 3 I am with Ms. Elliott. How many years, how many 4 years -- how many years has it been since I 5 messed her name up. I kept getting it backwards. So anyway, all right, so any questions 6 7 for Mr. Kirschenbaum? 8 Okay, not seeing any. 9 Is there anyone here representing the 10 ANC? They did -- we do have 11 Okay. 12 Ms. Schellin, for the ANC report I know that they had a representative, and they have a 13 14 letter of approval. But the letter I have we --15 think we need to supplement the record. 16 don't think that would hold anything But I notice is there a requirement 17 evening. 18 that we need a signature? MS. SCHELLIN: Yes, there is. 19 20 CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. So since we 2.1 don't have a signature I think it's pretty -- we 22 can just -- if they would give us a signature 23 because I didn't see one on the copy that I have. 24 And they have support but they do raise the

concern about what's going to actually go there.

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1	But they still have a vote of eight yes, zero as
2	far as no. And that's in our exhibit and in the
3	case file.
4	We just need to ask them to Exhibit
5	Number 20 just ask them for a letter with a
6	signature.
7	Okay. Do we have any organizations
8	and persons who are here in support? Any
9	organizations and persons who are in support?

11	much qualifying, qualified support from the
12	Lamond-Riggs Citizens Association.

And we have had a unique experience with companies changing 15 the around us. 16 17 Recently the storage company built a facility next door on the northern side and 18 19 created a flooding crisis on our side. We have 20 lived with the empty buildings on the southern 2.1 And now they're changing the parking for I 22 quess some future use. We were not involved in the future use 2.3 24 by the storage company, but we are interested in 25 being involved in whatever is going to happen

next door to us in the future. 1 We have not been reimbursed for the 2 3 building, in damages to our but we are 4 negotiations about that now. But this changing 5 of the community is not something we are opposed to, but it is important that we are involved and 6 7 included. Because if the desire is to create 8 something new and more dynamic, we expect to be a 9 part of our community. We have been not involved before, but 10 we are involved now because it's necessary. 11 12 I am here to represent that position. 13 CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. 14 MR. SHELTON: That's why I have no opinion; I have no information. I don't know who 15 I don't know who's involved in it. 16 started it. I now know that the ANC and the community is 17 18 saying yes, but I'm concerned about what's going 19 to happen next. 20 And I'm not opposed to development. 2.1 don't want to be the house that 22 excluded between the giants as they go up. 23 CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. Thank you, Mr. 24 Shelton. 25 Mr. Shelton, you're with the DC Credit

2	MR. SHELTON: Yes, sir.
3	CHAIRMAN HOOD: And Dave McWilliams,
4	I'm very familiar with that organization.
5	MR. SHELTON: Yes. We've had good
6	experiences with Zoning through the years, yes.
7	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Well, we want to make
8	sure you continue to have a good experience.
9	MR. SHELTON: Yes, sir.
10	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Because I remember
11	when you moved out from over there across from
12	Way of the Cross.
13	MR. SHELTON: Yes, sir.
14	CHAIRMAN HOOD: You've been around a
15	while, and Dave McWilliams and Jerome
16	Shelton's a name actually I know the name.
17	I've never, I don't think, met you, but I've
18	heard the name for years.
19	So here's why, Mr. Ferris, with that
20	because I think it's very important because they
21	also, too, moved from over on that side over to
22	where Way of the Cross was off of 6th was it
23	6th Street?
24	MR. SHELTON: 9th and D.
25	CHAIRMAN HOOD: 9th and D. They moved

from 9th and D over to where they are now. 1 Ι 2 remember when you all did that. 3 So I would ask, Mr. Ferris, that you 4 all apprise them and keep them in tune with 5 what's going on. It's a map amendment, would ask, Mr. Epting, that you all work with Mr. 6 7 Shelton. Because one thing, I have my ear to the street so I will hear about it. But I would ask 8 9 that you all would continue to work with them as 10 well. 11 And I'm sure that I can take Mr. 12 Ferris's and Mr. Epting's word that that will 13 happen. 14 MR. FERRIS: We're happy to work with 15 our neighbors, absolutely. Okay, great. 16 CHAIRMAN HOOD: 17 MR. SHELTON: And one more point. 18 don't know exactly where to start, but I will be 19 talking with our attorneys, the Cube place has 20 changed the parking on our side of the street. 2.1 There's an area that where there used to be a 22 driveway which has been removed by the building 2.3 that's been built which is now called no parking. 24 And I think that that area needs to have hourly 25 parking during business hours.

1	CHAIRMAN HOOD: I would encourage you
2	all some things, I don't like to use the word
3	purview down here, but some things are not within
4	our realm of what we do. That building
5	apparently what you're talking about I think you
6	can work with the ANC and also work with the
7	owners of that facility. I think. I don't know
8	who it is. But I think I am aware I know, I
9	know the area very well.
10	MR. SHELTON: Yes.
11	CHAIRMAN HOOD: But I would encourage
12	you to work with the ANCs and try to find a
13	mitigation method.
14	MR. SHELTON: That's why I'm here.
15	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay.
16	MR. SHELTON: To find the process we
17	need to follow and then begin to follow it.
18	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Right. I would start
19	with ANC 4B. I think that's in 4B. Scot
20	MR. SHELTON: Yes.
21	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Knickerbocker is
22	the chairperson.
23	MR. FERRIS: I know. I know of it, I
24	just didn't go to the meetings in preparation for
25	this because the letter came to me as a cold

1	communication, meaning that it was a come to
2	arms. And with nobody to contact other than this
3	office.
4	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay.
5	MR. FERRIS: We're glad you came in.
б	MR. SHELTON: Yes.
7	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Yes. So again, Mr.
8	Shelton, I know the work that you've done. I've
9	heard your name many times from Eddie Harrison,
10	my late friend.
11	MR. SHELTON: Yes.
12	CHAIRMAN HOOD: So I would encourage
13	you to start at those places. And they're
14	willing to they will be
15	MR. SHELTON: And this is the first
16	chance we've had to talk.
17	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay.
18	MR. SHELTON: That's why I've been
19	hesitant, because I didn't know what was going
20	on.
21	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay.
22	MR. SHELTON: Not here to disrupt,
23	just here to get information to work something
24	out.
25	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Thank you. We

1	appreciate you coming down.
2	Any questions for Mr. Shelton?
3	Okay. All right, thank you very much.
4	Okay. Again, we're looking forward to
5	that, Mr. Epting and Mr. Ferris. Okay.
6	All right, anything else, colleagues?
7	I think this is definitely flavored right. It
8	has a lot of support, flavored with the follow-up
9	which we would continue to strongly encourage.
10	Any remarks on this? If not, I'll
11	take a motion.
12	It's two votes. Ms. Schellin, this is
13	two votes; right?
14	MS. SCHELLIN: It is.
15	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Yes, it's two votes.
16	MS. SCHELLIN: And I made a mistake.
17	This is a contested case. This one is contested.
18	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Oh. Well if it's
19	MS. SCHELLIN: It doesn't change it,
20	it's still two votes.
21	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Well, in that case I
22	want to know the update, Mr. Shelton. I want to
23	know what the update is before I Mr. Shelton,
24	I want you to hear this. I want to know the
25	update of working with the Credit Union before I

1	take final action. Okay?
2	MR. FERRIS: Certainly.
3	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. So it was going
4	to be done whether it was a map amendment.
5	Okay, so still two votes; right?
6	MS. SCHELLIN: Uh-huh.
7	CHAIRMAN HOOD: So before the second
8	before final action I'd like to give me a
9	status.
10	MR. FERRIS: As a written submission?
11	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Yeah, written
12	submission.
13	MR. FERRIS: Certainly.
14	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. All right, so
15	there needs to be some work going on. Okay.
16	You all have each other's numbers?
17	Hold on. Before you leave, you all have each
18	other's numbers?
19	Okay, good. Okay, we're good.
20	COMMISSIONER SHAPIRO: Mr. Chairman,
21	I move that we take proposed actions under
22	Commission Case Number 18-11, 18-11 zoning map
23	amendment 5642 to 5650 3rd Street, N.E., Lots
24	848, 849, and 199 in Square 3710.
25	I look for a second.

1	VICE CHAIR MILLER: Second.
2	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay, it's been moved
3	and properly seconded.
4	Any further discussion?
5	All in favor?
6	(Chorus of aye.)
7	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Ms. Schellin, do we
8	have a proxy?
9	MS. SCHELLIN: No, sir, we do not.
10	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay, we can just
11	record the vote.
12	MS. SCHELLIN: The staff will record
13	the vote 4 to 0 to 1 to approve proposed action
14	in Zoning Commission Case Number 18-11.
15	Commissioner Shapiro moving, Commissioner Miller
16	seconding, Commissioners Hood, May, and I'm
17	sorry, Hood and May in support. Commissioner
18	Turnbull not present, not voting.
19	And if we could have the Applicant
20	provide a draft order. Is a summary order okay
21	in this case? Yes?
22	CHAIRMAN HOOD: I believe, yeah.
23	MS. SCHELLIN: Summary order since
24	there's no opposition. So if we could get a
25	summary order in two weeks?

1	MR. FERRIS: Yes, we can do that.
2	MS. SCHELLIN: Okay.
3	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Will that allow time
4	to meet with the DC Teachers'?
5	MR. FERRIS: If it doesn't, I'll
6	coordinate with the secretary to extend the time.
7	Does that work?
8	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay, that works.
9	MS. SCHELLIN: Okay.
10	CHAIRMAN HOOD: You've been around a
11	while, Mr. Ferris. Kind of know how we work
12	around here.
13	MR. FERRIS: That was relative.
14	MS. SCHELLIN: Right. So I'll stay
15	this evening and refer this to NCPC so that the
16	30-day comment period we could put this on for
17	a final on March 11.
18	CHAIRMAN HOOD: Okay. Anything else,
19	Ms. Schellin?
20	MS. SCHELLIN: No, sir.
21	CHAIRMAN HOOD: All right. I want to
22	thank everyone for their participation tonight.
23	This hearing is adjourned.
